A Community Coming Together

Every two seconds someone in Hawaii needs blood for a life-saving treatment or emergency care. Blood Bank of Hawaii is the **sole blood provider for our state**, working 24 hours a day, 7 days a week to serve the hospitals on the six main islands and support Tripler Army Medical Center.

Without a local blood supply, many hospital programs and treatments such as emergency trauma, neonatal/pediatric ICU services, organ transplants and cancer treatment would not be possible.

Although expensive mainland blood sources can be helpful, the complete unavailability of these external sources during the COVID-19 pandemic clearly demonstrated the need for our isolated state to achieve 100% blood self-sufficiency. For this reason, Blood Bank of Hawaii is now an even greater partner of Hawaii's emergency preparedness plan.

Our Bold New Plan, including construction of a new headquarters, is being designed with Hawaii's long-term future in mind. We are here to ensure that regardless of what hits our shores, we will have the technology, equipment, resources and donors to continue providing local patients with life-saving blood products.

As part of our plan, we had already established an operation framework to cope with disasters. This enabled us to quickly bring the Dillingham Donor Center back on line during the COVID-19 shut down, and to switch from public drives to fixed locations, such as Young Street, with stationary bloodmobiles.

Our donors were heroic. Long-time donors, first timers and even those who were scared of needles—stepped up to lend a hand. Many donors had lost their jobs or served as essential workers on other front lines. They too, were hurting. And yet, there they were with

arms out to provide blood for their neighbors. For nine months, Oahu donors provided the blood supply for the whole state. When we were finally able to resume monthly Neighbor Island drives, those donors quickly filled every slot. Blood donors were so vital during this time that they were classified by the federal government as "critical and essential."

Throughout the pandemic, countless individuals and organizations came together to support our mission, including our hospital partners, Lifesaver Clubs (who also were going through their own pivot), members of the Hawaii CCP coalition, government agencies, elected officials, property managers who provided space for our bloodmobiles, and other caring supporters and collaborators who helped to guide our work.

And we mustn't forget our staff. On our own front lines, our employees had the heart of champions. I cannot fully express my gratitude for their flexibility and calm dedication as they adapted to new safety guidelines, protected each other and our donors, and ensured that Hawaii's blood flow didn't stop.

So much has happened in these past two years that I saved my introduction until the end of this letter. I am honored to serve as the board chair of this vital organization that has protected Hawaii's health for nearly 80 years. As we approach this significant anniversary, the board and I look forward to ensuring a safe and sustainable blood supply for generations to come.



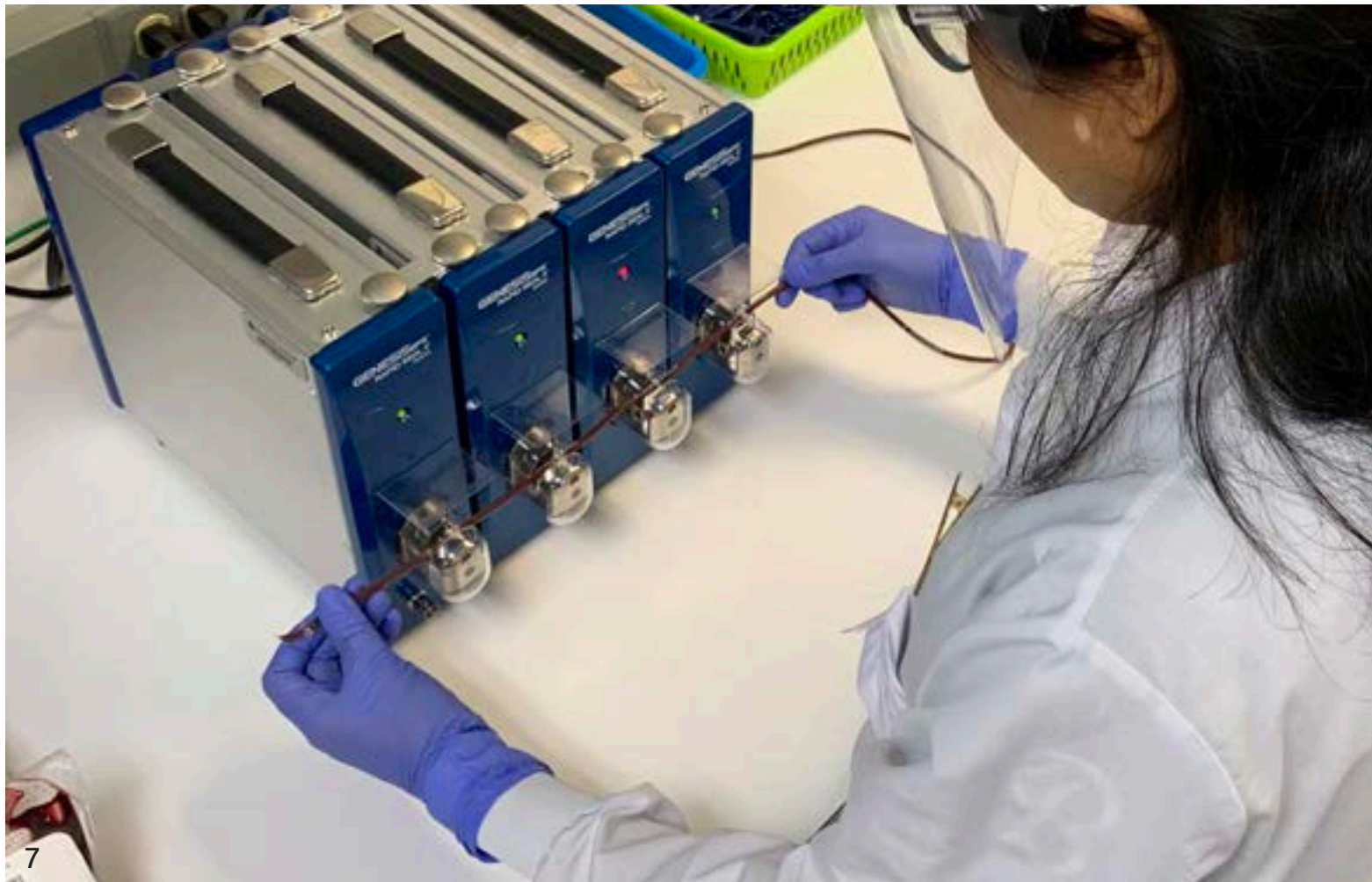
Conceptual internal perspective

Technology for the Future

From the very beginning, building a new blood center was considered a strategic necessity. Maintenance costs at Dillingham were escalating, rail was headed in our direction and medical technologies were advancing faster than our aged facility could keep up. Then COVID-19 appeared and the reality of coping with emerging pathogens transformed from hypothetical to real life.

COVID-19 Quick Response

The pandemic provided an excellent opportunity to implement the foundational elements we formed over the last eight years and we quickly pivoted to our Bold New Plan that prioritized safety and compliance with all county, state and federal guidelines.

All publicly hosted and Neighbor Island blood drives were suspended and redirected to our Oahu facilities where the safety of our staff and donors could be carefully controlled. Our Dillingham Donor Center was reactivated to augment our Young Street facility, supplemented by three bloodmobiles at fixed sites. All blood drives operated strictly on an appointment basis.

Faced with an imminent 85% inventory loss due to shuttered drives, we immediately enhanced transparency and collaboration with and between hospital partners. We also became active participants in Hawaii's Healthcare Emergency Management Committee and Chief Medical Officers groups tasked with controlling the spread of COVID-19.

Combined with our ground-based donor efforts, we were able to send a steady stream of blood products where they were needed.

From COVID-19 to CCP

As soon as COVID-19 Convalescent Plasma (CCP) was granted Emergency Use Authorization by the U.S. Food and Drug Administration, we mobilized our resources in collaboration with the Hawaii CCP Coalition and became the sole provider of life-saving CCP to patients in Hawaii and Guam. In Hawaii, we used data to identify the most impacted populations, which were Filipino, Pacific Islander and Native Hawaiian.

Bold New Plan

The only way to effectively manage evolving pathogens like COVID-19 is to have the right technologies already in place. Our Bold New Plan and upcoming construction of a new headquarters will play a critical role in making Hawaii disaster-ready.

Design and planning will soon be completed for our new 19,000-square-foot headquarters and FDA Biosafe Level Two facility. This new permanent home will be open 24 hours a day, seven days a week, offering unrestricted access to process, test, store and distribute blood, as well as test patient blood samples.

Unlike our aging Dillingham facility, which cannot be retrofitted to meet future priorities, the new donor center and storage facility will utilize highly precise temperature controls, reliable data connectivity, a bio-waste storage area and other technologies that make it possible to perform advanced medical procedures in our state. Our new location will facilitate the development of a Level 1 trauma center.

Along with physical support, we are building collaborations with hospital partners and nurturing relationships with mainland testing companies to add to our versatility.

When it opens its doors, our new headquarters will be home to a dynamic new business with fresh opportunities for employment and professional development.

80 and Proud
As we approach our 80th anniversary, we're proud to reflect on our mission of blood self-sufficiency that began in 1941. From World Wars to the recent pandemic, we are ready to protect the health and well-being of our island home.

Hospital Partners

In April 2020, we convened a coalition to jointly implement a statewide COVID-19 convalescent plasma (CCP) program to treat severely ill patients hospitalized with the coronavirus. Coalition members included The Queen’s Health Systems, Hawaii Pacific Health, Kaiser Permanente, the State Department of Health, University of Hawaii John A. Burns School of Medicine (JABSOM), laboratories and a nationally renowned researcher. Through this unique collaborative model, the coalition created policies and processes and helped to recruit donors while we focused on collections and maintaining supply. The coalition’s goal was to ensure every Hawaii COVID-19 patient needing CCP would get treated without delay. Thanks to local donors and supplemented by mainland imports, we proudly met our goal.

We’re honored to be the sole blood provider for Hawaii serving the hospitals on the six main Islands and supporting Tripler Army Medical Center. It’s a privilege we’ve taken seriously throughout our history, and as we near our 80th anniversary in 2021, we’re committed to evolving alongside our partners to achieve new heights in patient care

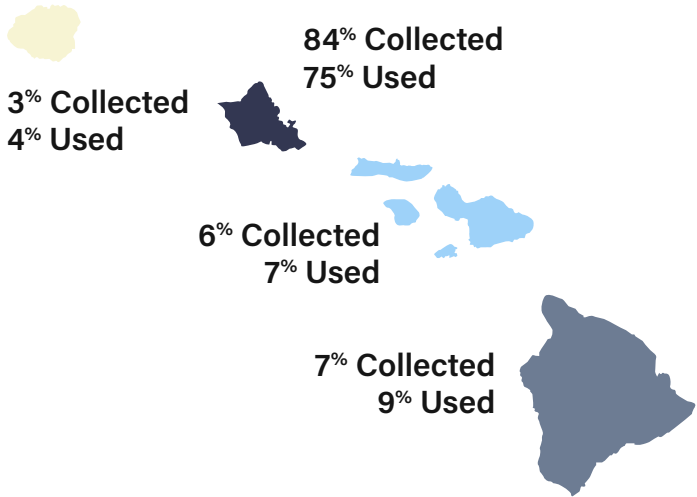




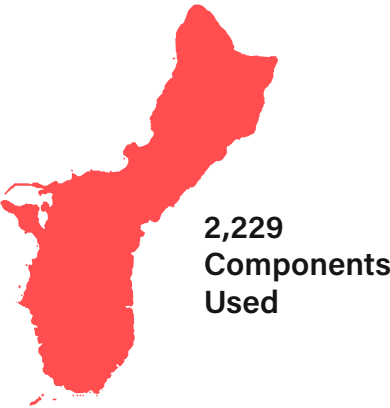

Blood Bank of Hawaii's Quick Thinking Leads to Life-saving CCP

During our nearly 80 years of service to Hawaii, we have continuously innovated and protected Hawaii's blood supply from public health challenges including an array of bacterial and viral infectious diseases. In spring 2020, as COVID-19 surged through the U.S. mainland and Hawaii without a cure, we not only revamped our ongoing operations, but initiated a new product and service called COVID-19 Convalescent Plasma (CCP). CCP is an experimental treatment in which life-saving plasma is taken from recovered COVID-19 patients and used to treat hospitalized patients suffering from the virus.

At Blood Bank of Hawaii, we were closely monitoring the pandemic. We became aware of a national clinical trial to treat hospitalized COVID-19 patients with plasma collected from recovered individuals and wanted Hawaii's patients to have access to this experimental

treatment. As a result of Hawaii's participation in the national trial, the CCP treatment was fully funded by the federal government with no cost to Hawaii's hospitals, insurers or patients.

During FY '20, between April and September, over 200 local CCP recovered COVID-19 donors came forward and BBH distributed nearly 1,300 doses to treat over 650 patients. In anticipation of the 2020 summer patient surge, we also began importing CCP so that all potential patients would have access to this treatment, which at that time was one component of a three-drug cocktail most often used in the clinical treatment regimen. The foundation was laid for a strong program that expanded through spring 2021 until the first vaccines became available in our state. In total, approximately 3,300 lifesaving doses of CCP were collected locally for Hawaii's needs.

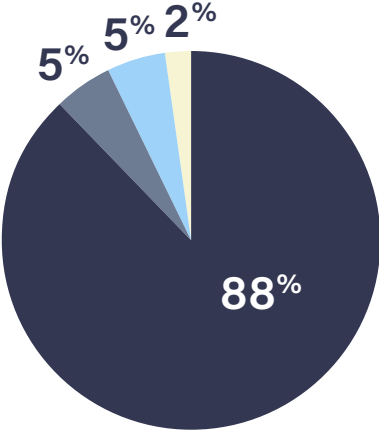

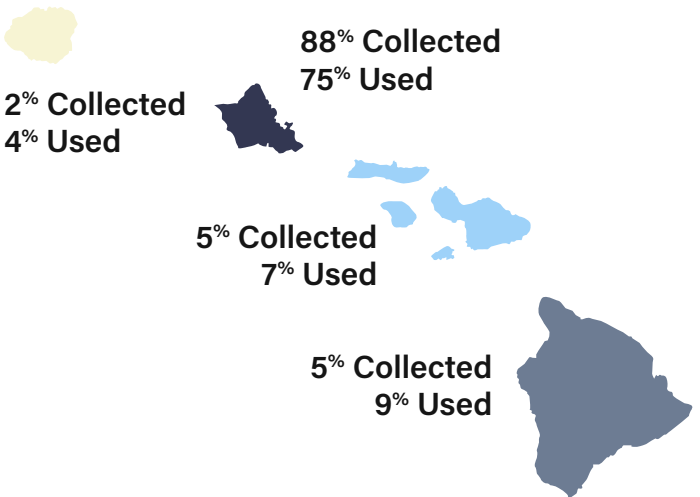
